Director's Notes

OKLAHOMA! is a classic. It is based on a 1931 play called "Green Grow the Lilacs" and hit Broadway in 1943. In 1955, the film version debuted on the Silver Screen. Since its inception, it has appeared countless times on stages across the world, including in London's West End starring a relatively unknown Hugh Jackman. Most recently, a revamped Broadway revival opened to rave reviews in 2019.

It is a lovely story that takes us back to a seemingly more simple time on the prairie "where the June bugs zoom." We love to sing the songs and bask in the simple splendor of the good feelings. Admittedly, among the sweet love stories and amiable characters, there are some darker themes as well as some insensitivities to race or gender roles, especially when viewed through a 2022 lense.

Suicide is one of those darker themes which may seem glossed over or made light of. I, personally, have been effected by suicide, having lost both friends and family members to it. Suicide affects our students and their family members as does depression, anxiety, and severe stress. We are fortunate to live in a society where help is readily available and accessible. I highly encourage anyone who is thinking about suicide in any way to seek professional help and/or reach out to our counselors here on campus. In OKLAHOMA!, suicide is weaponized by a complex character desperate to rid himself of his rival. It being a critical plotline, as well as for legal reasons, cannot be removed from the show, but I hope you will take into consideration the history of the show, the complexity of humanity, and the resources and information we have available for us to combat the suicide epidemic. I hope, too, that you can appreciate the artistic approach we've attempted to take as well as the execution of these scenes and songs by these incredibly talented students.




