DRC BEACON ASSESSMENT

This week, students in grades 6-8 will be taking The BEACON assessment in ELA and Math. This non-graded formative assessment helps address student instructional needs and measure progress throughout the year. When students complete the Beacon tests, their scores include a growth measure and indicate if they are in need of support, near, or prepared for grade-level targets. The adaptive format allows students, parents, and teachers to have a more accurate picture of achievement as the item difficulty adjusts to student ability levels and pinpoints a realistic indication and diagnosis of “where students are.” Beacon assessment results are also a meaningful piece of information to identify potential gifted learners. 2023-24 Riverwatch Exam Schedule and Policy.

The following is the exam schedule and policy for the 2023-24 school year. All courses will have midterms and final exams. The test dates for this year have already been set. Please see the schedule of tests listed below and mark your calendars!

Midterms: December 13-15

- December 13th - Language Arts (All grades)
- December 14th - Science (All grades) and Spanish (8th grade only)
- December 15th - Math (All grades) and Social Studies (All grades)

Final Exams: May 16-21

- May 16th - Social Studies (All grades)
- May 17th - Language Arts (All grades)
- May 20th - Science (All grades) and Spanish (8th grade only)
- May 21st - Math (All grades)

Please note that no exams may be taken early - there will be no exceptions. All exams that are missed due to being out of town early will be placed into the gradebook as missing. Missing grades do calculate as a **zero**, but a grade change can be made for missed midterms (midterms only) if the student takes the midterms on the first day back to school in January. **There will be no opportunities to make up for missed end-of-year final exams.**

TRANSPORTATION INFORMATION

Carpool: Morning Carpool will begin at 8:15 and end at the 9:00 tardy bell. Please ensure all drivers pull as far forward as possible to make room for others. Our busiest carpool time is between 8:30-8:50. Please plan to leave in time to allow for traffic and longer carpool lines if you will arrive during this time.

Afternoon carpool will start at 4:12 and continue until the last student is picked up. Please make sure you arrive to pick your student up by 4:30. Please pull forward as far as possible to allow space for others. Encourage your student to look for your vehicle and have their belongings ready to load quickly and efficiently.

Bus: Transportation rosters will be available to view during open house. Students will be sorted by grade level and listed alphabetically along their grade levels hallways. Students and families will be able to see their assigned route number, estimated morning and afternoon pick-up/drop-off times, and bus stop locations. Families are also able to view this same transportation information by using their Parent Portal account and navigating to the Transportation tab. BUS SAFETY WITH CARRY-ON ITEMS

Any large item (band instrument, athletic equipment, school projects, etc.) on an FCS school bus during AM and PM routes must meet the following guidelines:



1. The student must be able to safely manage the item without any assistance while loading, sitting in their seat, and unloading the bus.
2. The item must be maintained in that student's seating space at all times.
3. The item cannot be stored on the floor, under a seat, or on a seat.
4. The item being held by a student in their seating space cannot block the driver's view of the passenger compartment or the immediate exterior of the bus.

Thank you for your cooperation as we work to ensure student safety.

BUS STOP CHANGES

Students are assigned one bus stop, morning and afternoon. FCS Transportation does not authorize bus stop changes where students can go home with friends or relatives or get off the bus at a bus stop other than their designated bus stop assigned to them and their home address. The only exception is in court-ordered joint custody scenarios where an additional address has been updated and verified in their IC profile.
