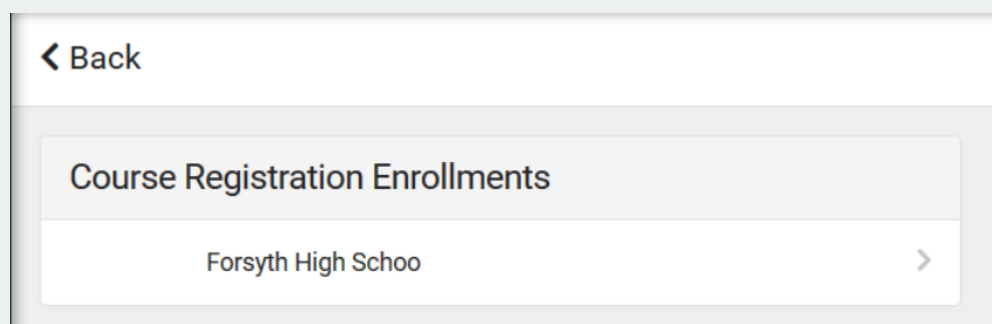

- On the left-hand side of your screen, select **More**. Then select **Course Registration**. (See figure below)

- The next screen will show you your student's recommended courses for next year. These will be listed under **Required**. You will also notice at the top of the screen a percent complete bar and Units (xx/xx). Each course is comprised of units. Normally, a yearlong course equals 6 units and a semester course equals 3 units. You will be able to select elective courses until you reach the maximum of 42 units. All courses requested after the 42 units will be Alternate Courses.
- At the bottom of the screen is a blue box- **Add Course**. Select this box.

Scheduling 101

To ensure that NFHS is able to properly staff and schedule students for the 2024-2025, students and families need to review their schedules in detail during the elective selection and course waiver window. Students should consider their extracurricular involvement, balance of schedule, as well as the specific courses that they are requesting.

Early January

- Core academic teachers will complete recommendations for students. Teachers spend significant time considering work ethic, grades, and scores. We encourage students and parents to consider these recommendations and reach out to teachers with questions.

January 22, 2024- January 29, 2024

- Students will complete the online elective portal and any course waiver requests (for courses they were not recommended for) during the open portal window.

February 2024

- Counselors will meet one on one with every current NFHS student through English classes at North Forsyth High School.. Current NFHS students may reach out to their individual counselor to schedule an appointment, if they do not have an English class on campus.

March 1, 2024- March 6, 2024

- The portal will open for View Only for students to view their course requests and ensure that all waivers and application based classes have been processed correctly. **After this point, schedule corrections will only be considered if it meets one of the schedule correction criteria. Change Requests will no longer be considered.**

August 2024

- Following the release of schedule in the summer, students will only be able to request a schedule correction for the above reasons. Following the end of the schedule correction window, schedule corrections will no longer be considered.

All students should carefully consider their course selections in the spring, as NFHS will only allow schedule corrections for the following reasons:

- The student has already earned credit in the course.
- The student has not met the course prerequisites.
- The student needs a specific class to complete a pathway.
- The student has a dual enrollment conflict.
- A Senior needs a specific class to graduate.
- Administrative balancing of classes.
- All other requests will be denied. If a student waives into a class during the waiver process, **they will not be eligible to waive back out.** Department chairs and counselors will review all waiver requests.

Frequently Asked Questions

1. Will my child have the opportunity to change their mind about electives after selections are made in parent portal.

- Elective registration is from Monday, January 22 at 8am to Monday, January 29 at 4pm. You may make changes during this time frame. Students must make their selections and choose three alternate selections in the event that your student does not get their first choice. Once the portal is closed on January 29th, there will not be a chance to amend these choices. If you select a semester class "s", please select 2 to ensure a full schedule.

2. Will my child have an opportunity to change the courses their 8th grade teacher recommended for the upcoming school year?

- Yes, during the waiver period students can request to take another course, as long as your student has the pre-requisite to take the course. **The waiver period is from January 22nd at 8am through January 29th at 4pm.** Note: any student who waives into a course **MUST** stay with that choice. Students are NOT allowed to drop out of any course he/she waived into. Teachers spend time considering recommendations, so we encourage students to really think about their extracurricular involvement and work ethic when considering waiving into a more rigorous course.

3. What is the purpose of the course waiver?

- The purpose of the course waiver is for students and/or parents to disagree with the recommended courses made by the student's teacher. Students and/or parents will need to complete the course waiver if you want to change a core academic or elective class a student has been recommended for.

4. I am typing in an elective course and it is not working? Why can I not add this elective?

- This may be happening for a couple of reasons. Some electives require a prerequisite course. If you have not taken the prerequisite course, you will not be able to sign up for the class. If you are looking to add an upper level world language course, your teacher must recommend you for the course. If you would like to add these upper level courses despite the teacher recommendation, you will have to fill out the waiver form.

5. What are alternate courses?

- If an elective fills up, we utilize an identified alternate course to ensure a complete schedule. Another scenario would be if there is a conflict with the elective courses selected. We do the best we can to put you in all your first choice electives; however, we cannot always accomplish this goal. If you do not select alternate courses, you will be added to courses with availability.

6. If I have submitted an application for a course, when will my schedule reflect the class(es) I have applied for?

- Once the completed applications have been turned in and the teachers have accepted or denied students for these classes, counselors will adjust schedules accordingly. Application courses include Office Aide, Newspaper, Yearbook, IE2 (seniors only), Raider Station, Library Science, AP Capstone, Internship Forsyth.

7. Should I take Health/Personal Fitness in the summer?

- There is no recommendation to take these courses over the summer; however, if you choose to do so, there is a protocol that must be followed in order to receive credit for the course. If you choose to take these state REQUIRED courses over the summer through GAVS it is your responsibility to bring the transcript for each course to NFHS. The parent of the student MUST complete a signed form. FVA courses will automatically be added to the transcript. NOTE: STUDENTS WILL NOT BE GUARANTEED AN ELECTIVE CHOICE BECAUSE THEY DECIDED TO TAKE THESE COURSES OVER THE SUMMER. ELECTIVES WILL BE CHOSEN BASED ON SEATS AVAILABLE. We encourage you to select Forsyth Virtual Academy, if your student chooses to take the course over the summer, if offered through FVA.

Frequently Asked Questions

8. Should I take virtual courses?

- Every family should evaluate their student's ability to manage virtual courses and online learning. Information regarding Forsyth Virtual and/or Georgia Virtual registration will be shared through our website later this spring.

9. What time does school start and end?

- School starts at 8:25 am and ends at 3:40pm

10. How much time do I have between classes?

- There is a six minute transition period between classes.

11. What do I bring to school the first day of school?

- Each teacher will advise your student about their expectations for supplies. The first day they should bring paper and pen/pencil and one folder/notebook.

12. Can I prepay my lunch account like I did in middle school?

- Yes, you may login to "My Payments Plus" (MPP) and put money on your account. Please see our website, under "Quick Links" for this url if you are unfamiliar.

13. When will I eat lunch?

- We eat lunch during 4th period or 5th period, depending on the daily bell schedule.

14. Where do I catch the bus, and when will it pick me up?

- All bus routes are available in Parent Portal. It is important to find your bus number, time of pick up, and the afternoon slot number so you know where to find your bus at the end of the day.

15. How do I join a club?

- We will host Club-a-palazoo, a club fair, for all students at the beginning of the school year, during Raider Time. Students can view all club offerings on the NFHS website, under the Extracurricular tab.

16. What is Raider Time?

- Raider Time is a dedicated time built into the schedule for students to receive remediation, enrichment, and extra help from teachers. Students will register for a Raider Time session each day of the week.

17. How do I join a sports team?

- Check the NFHS website at NFraidersathletics.com for a complete list of our sports programs by season. All sports teams will require a tryout, so make sure you check early in the year so as not to miss out.

18. Will I be able to select a locker?

- Yes, students will have the opportunity to select a locker at the beginning of the year, if they are interested.
