

Certificate of Credit in Nurse Aide

Program Overview

The Nurse Aide technical certificate of credit prepares students with classroom training and practice as well as the clinical experiences necessary to care for patients in various settings including general medical and surgical hospitals, nursing care facilities, community care facilities for the elderly, and home health care services. Students who successfully complete the Nurse Aide technical certificate of credit may be eligible to sit for the National Nurse Aide Assessment program (NNAAP) which determines competency to become enrolled in the State Nurse Aide Registry. The Nurse Aide program is relevant courses that can offer you great experience and is favorable when looking to apply for additional advance health care fields such as Nursing.

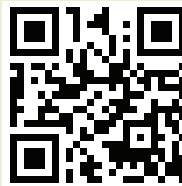

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Clinical Requirements

All of these requirements are at extra cost to the student (Not covered by MOWR or scholarships).

1. Students must provide proof of current immunizations.
2. Proof of (negative or treatment ongoing) TST,
3. Background check
4. 9 panel drug screen
5. Students must provide a copy of driver's license or government issued ID.
6. Social security card
7. Copy of current CPR card
8. Additional clinical costs

Students with a positive background check and /or positive drug screen may not be eligible to attend clinical labs per the discretion of the clinical facility, and may have problems acquiring a job even if they have completion of class and passed state boards.

Classroom, Lab, and Clinical Hours

NAST 1100 Hourly Break down:

Classroom	60 hours (16 hours of information to be covered on topics mandated by State before clinical time can start.)
Skills practice in lab	45 hours minimum
Clinical hours: Clinical on-site	30 hours: at a clinical site (24 of these hours must be in a nursing home mandated by State)
Total hours:	135 hours minimum (Matching TCSG standards and GMCF criteria)

After successfully completing/passing the Nurse Aide Certificate of Credit course, you may sit for the State NACES Certification Written and Skills Competency Exam. There is a one year window from the time of course completion to take the exam.

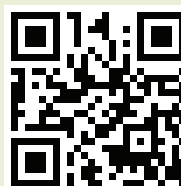
