WHAT IS DUAL ENROLLMENT:

The Dual Enrollment Program provides opportunities for eligible students in grades 10-12 to enroll part-time or full-time in postsecondary institutions and take college courses to earn both high school and college credit

State funded 30 credit hours.

ELIGIBILITY AND GENERAL INFORMATION

- Student must apply and be accepted to postsecondary institution
- Eligible 10th graders can take a CTAE course or must have approved minimum SAT/ACT score
- College Calendar may be different than Forsyth County School Calendar
- Parking is not guaranteed/transportation is student's responsibility
- Students may be eligible to take summer courses through the Dual Enrollment program
- A Dual Enrollment student must be in compliance with Georgia state law of having registered for the Selective Service by required school application deadlines in order to be eligible for funding.

POST SECONDARY DUAL ENROLLMENT INSTITUTION ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Admission/Admission requirements are the student's responsibility.
- Each post secondary institution will post their own admission requirements, deadlines, have a process for application/acceptance/registering for classes.
- Research transfer of credits for instate and out of state institutions.

COURSE SELECTION AND REGISTRATION

- All course **advisement** must be completed with the school counselor.
- All course **registration** must be completed with the college.
- There is a course directory on gafutures.org

WITHDRAWALS/DROPPING COURSES

- Students may withdraw from a course during the withdrawal period.
- All withdrawals must be approved by school counselor.
- Student will be placed in a comparable course if available upon withdrawal. Student will have a grade of 59 posted until comparable course has been completed.
- Check with colleges to verify consequences of withdrawal grade posted (academic probation, recording, etc.)
- There are no equivalent courses for withdrawal over the summer.

GRADING AND RECORDING

- A- 95% B- 85% C- 75% D-70% F-59%
- Quality Point Added to Forsyth County Transcript.
- HOPE GPA adds a half quality point up to a 4.0 for academic core courses.
- If a student fails a DE course, they are not eligible to retake.
- There may be an EOC test component (American Lit).
- Dual Enrollment course with a lab only counts in one spot in the schedule.
- Minimum of 4 classes each semester
- 2.5 Carnegie Units for GHSA


FUNDING

- Funding Cap is 30 semester or 45 quarter credit hours.
- Maximum of 15 semester or 12 quarter hours per term (Fall, Spring, Summer).
- Students may be able to self pay after use of 30 credit hours. These hours may be in our outside of schedule (see counselor for more information).
