Simple explanation of this Rental Agreement

The purpose of the Rental Agreement is to change the status of the Living Arrangement of an SSI recipient with Social Security. By completing the agreement you are saying to Social Security that you are establishing a household within a household based on a Flat Rate for Room and Board.

How to use this Rental Agreement.

- 1. Complete the form. The amount you are charging must reflect **fair market value** for the area where you live. Generally speaking around \$450 -\$475 represents fair market value.
- 2. Make an appointment at the local Social Security office by calling the toll free number 1-800-772-1213.
- 3. Ask for an appointment with an SSI Claims representative to discuss Living Arrangement.
- 4. Take the completed form to the appointment with you.

Questions you may be asked.

- 1. Does this price represent fair market value? Yes
- 2. Would you charge someone who is not a family member the same price? Yes
- 3. If the person fails to pay would you evict them? Yes

What you should do for record keeping.

- 1. Each month you must collect the assigned amount from the person receiving SSI.
- 2. Write them a receipt to show they have paid the assigned amount for that month.
- 3. Keep a copy of the receipt in case Social Security asks for it.
