

Updated District Lines LEARN MORE!

Every ten years following completion of the census, the U.S. Constitution requires all voting districts be reevaluated to ensure equal representation. As law establishes that representatives are to be based on population, district lines are re-drawn as needed based upon changes in population. In Forsyth County, census data has resulted in changes to all voting districts: congressional, state senate, state house, county commission and county school board.

Things to Know

- The current district lines remain in effect through December 31, 2022.
- The recently-approved district lines, which are based on 2020 census data, will go into effect January 1, 2023.
- The district representing a voter today may be different from the district that will represent the voter starting on January 1, 2023.
- The district representing a voter today may be different from the district appearing on a voter's ballot during the 2022 election cycle.
- Voters will be voting on the office holders for the recently-approved districts (that were scheduled to be on the ballot this year) that will go into effect on January 1, 2023.
- In the case of the Forsyth County Board of Education, due to the approved legislation one of the districts set to appear on the upcoming ballot is different from what was anticipated and published. The Board of Education District 5 (formerly an area referred to as District 2) seat will now appear on the ballot for the 2022 election cycle.

Congressional district:

Congressional district 6 will represent all of Forsyth County, as well as all of Dawson County and portions of Cherokee, Cobb, Fulton and Gwinnett counties.

State Senate districts:

Senate district 27 will represent the majority of Forsyth County. This district will not represent any other county.

Senate district 48 will represent a portion of south Forsyth County, as well as portions of Fulton and Gwinnett counties.

State House districts:

House district 11 will represent a portion of northwest Forsyth County, as well as all of Pickens County and a portion of Cherokee County.

House district 24 will represent a portion of western Forsyth County. This district will not represent any other county.

House district 25 will represent portions of southern Forsyth County, as well as a portion of Fulton County.

House district 26 will represent a portion of eastern Forsyth County. This district will not represent any other county.

House district 28 will represent portions of northern Forsyth County, as well as a portion of Hall County.

House district 100 will represent portions of southern Forsyth County, as well as portions of Gwinnett and Hall counties.
