Title One Program: Otwell Middle School is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Formal Complaint Procedures: Parents have the right to file a written complaint regarding the Title I program or plan if they feel it is not satisfactory. The complaint form can be found on the Otwell Title I webpage. If no resolution is determined with local school staff or administration, the complaint will be forwarded to the district office.

Who Participates in the Title I Program: All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families as well as local community members are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Otwell Middle School will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and migrant children. At our Annual Title I Meeting, held in September, parents are informed about the requirements and participation in Title I and parent rights.


