



- Alliance Academy for Innovation received a grant for \$5,000 for The Avenger Way and Amazing Avengers. This grant will fund the expansion of PBIS and The Avenger Way to identify and reward students for exemplifying The Avenger Way. This project will create a positive learning experience for all students and will recognize the dedication and teamwork of teachers and staff.
- Big Creek ES received a grant for \$3,650 for Hands-On Learning with Ozobots. This grant will provide for the purchase of a classroom set of Ozobot robots for students to expand hands-on learning through coding and programming.
- Big Creek ES received a grant for \$5,000 for Creative Communications Using iPads. This grant will provide iPads and a Macbook for students to use consistent apps and tools for lessons, which will encourage creativity and communication within students' learning.
- Brandywine ES received a grant for \$5,000 for Building Better Badgers Prize Cart. This grant will provide fill a mobile cart with rewards and incentives motivating students to exhibit positive behaviors.
- Brookwood ES received a grant for \$3,750 for Family Engagement Kits. This grant will provide materials to create 30 family engagement kits filled with books, activities, and consumable items that encourage families to interact and learn together about a variety of different topics. Students will have the opportunity to check out these kits through the media center to take home to use with their families.
- Chattahoochee ES received a grant for \$1,994 for The 3D Experience: Creation, Connection, and Discovery! The grants will provide for the purchase of a 3Doodler Learning Kit and Packs for students to use in their Science pathway. This allows students to explore learning in a different way by embracing innovation and demonstrating engagement with tactile, hands-on learning.
- Chestatee ES received a grant for \$4,900 for Crafting Pathways: Building Opportunities Through Instruction. This grant will provide Chromebooks for the media center to be used in the Library Sciences Pathway. This will empower students to become creators of educational content while simultaneously fostering a culture of collaboration and peer-to-peer learning.
- Coal Mountain ES received a grant for \$4,500 for Sensory Garden and Nature Center. This grant will expand the garden and nature center at Coal Mountain to a multi-sensory experience. These areas will not only be for growing food, learning life cycles, and learning about healthy eating habits but will also incorporate using all five senses to experience nature and promote a healthy mindset.
- Cumming ES received a grant for \$1,921.36 for Battles of the Books Team. This grant will establish the Battles of the Books team, a reading incentive program where students read books and come together to test their knowledge of the material read. The participating students will not only grow their literacy skills but will also grow in confidence and risk taking by participating in the culminating competition at the end of the school year.
- Denmark HS received a grant for \$5,000 for Healing Through the Arts Interactive Coloring Book, Volume 3. This grant will allow for many students in different departments to come together to create and share a coloring book. Through this collaborative project, the students will learn



valuable creative skills, engage in the collaborative process, inspire others through their published art and media arts, gain opportunities for their artistic growth, and most importantly help inspire and connect their community through the arts.

- Denmark HS received a grant for \$3,000 for Denmark Wellness Initiative. This grant will provide items for wellness sessions for students twice a month and a wellness room for teachers. These provide both staff and students an opportunity to spend time participating in an activity of choice and encourage positive relationships between students and their peers as well as students and teachers.
- East Forsyth HS received a grant for \$5,000 for Science Ambassadors. This grant provides materials for the high school Science Ambassadors to hold STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Math) Nights at nearby elementary schools. Each of these family nights host around 900 people where elementary students participate in science and engineering activities led by high school students.
- East Forsyth HS received a grant for \$5,000 for Sober Support and Sober Curious Therapy Groups. This grant will provide support for Therapeutic Recovery Network to facilitate support groups for identified students to help them to overcome issues, gain coping skills, and receive support from peers and family.
- East Forsyth HS One East Cluster received a grant for \$5,000 for One East Orchestra Program. This grant will provide support for the orchestra program that is available for the entire cluster elementary through high school. This program provides more sustainable and consistent orchestral learning and performance opportunities for all students.
- Haw Creek ES received a grant for \$3,000 for Playground Accessibility for ALL. This grant will enhance the existing playground to develop an all-encompassing play environment that promotes independent play for students with mobility needs.
- Kelly Mill ES received a grant for \$1,419.66 for Let's Get Quacking. This grant will introduce ducks into the school ecosystem. This innovative project will offer students hands-on learning opportunities, foster environmental stewardship, and promote positive behavior.
- Kelly Mill ES received a grant for \$5,000 for Reading is a Gift and So are Books! This grant will provide for the purchase of a book vending machine to encourage positive behavior and a love of learning in students.
- Little Mill ES received a grant for \$5,000 for PBIS at Little Mill: "We're Just Getting Started". This grant will provide rewards and incentives for positive behavior. Everyone in the building will be rewarded as they demonstrate what it means to be Honest, Empathetic, Respectful, and Determined.
- Midway ES received a grant for \$1,597.82 for Stock the Store: Midway Elementary begins PBIS Journey. This grant will provide funding for rewards and incentives to be used in the PBIS Store, encouraging positive behavior.
- Midway ES received a grant for \$1,575.25 for A Place and Space for All: Using Multi-Sensory Items to Meet the Social-Emotional Needs of Students. This grant will provide funding to create a sensory room and sensory pathways throughout the building to create safe spaces where



students can calm themselves and learn to self-regulate, therefore optimizing both learning and participation in the school environment.

- New Hope ES received a grant for \$2,750 for Breakout and SOAR. This grant will provide funding for Breakout EDU kits and software, which will be used to make education engaging and interactive for students while fostering learning opportunities and developing critical thinking, problem solving, and collaboration skills.
- Otwell MS received a grant for \$5,000 for International Language. This grant will be used to expand the collection of books in the native language of the school's students. These books will be used to further expand the learning experience and innovative opportunities for students.
- Piney Grove MS received a grant for \$400 for CHOICES Magazine. This grant will be used to continue the development of the health program at Piney Grove through the purchase of Scholastic's CHOICES magazine in print and digital to offer further curriculum about health-related content.

- Riverwatch MS received a grant for \$5,000 for PBIS Operations and Acknowledgements for 2024-25. This grant will support the school's mission of continuing to fund the purchase of the PBIS rewards communication and store inventory, acknowledgment resources for RMS PRIDE, and development as an Operational Tier 2 school with hopes of moving to a Distinguished Tier 2 school.
- Settles Bridge ES received a grant for \$3,423.98 for xTool for STEM and CTAE. This grant will provide xTool software and material for students to use for creative projects, collaboration, and innovation.
