



Pathway Information

To earn a medallion, students must be a member of a specific honor society and have completed at least 3 courses within their area of completion, as well as additional requirements.

Medallions can be earned in the following areas: advanced academic, fine arts, foreign language, and career tech.

Students must complete a virtual "Pathway Verification Form".

If a student qualifies for a medallion in multiple areas, they will receive a "pin" for each additional pathway. Students will only receive 1 medallion.

Pathway Information

To earn a medallion, students must be a member of a **specific honor society**.


- Advanced Academic: NHS or associated academic honor society (Ex. Mu Alpha Theta if getting a math medallion)

- World Language: NHS, SNHS (Spanish), FNHS (French)


Community Service Minimum Hour Requirement:



Testing

- Accuplacer/ASVAB or PSAT for TCSG
 - ACCUPLACER
 - Admissions exam by selective 2-year schools. Given on individual campuses.
 - ASVAB
 - Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery. The ASVAB is a timed multi-aptitude test, which is given at over 14,000 schools and Military Entrance Processing Stations (MEPS) nationwide and is developed and maintained by the Department of Defense.
 - DHS will be a testing site this year on 12/5.

NCAA

- Register with the eligibility center. (https://web3.ncaa.org/ecwr3/)
- Make sure you are still on course to meet core-course requirements (verify you have the correct number of core courses and that the core courses are on your high school's list with the eligibility center).
- After your junior year, have your high school counselor send a copy of your transcript to the NCAA Clearinghouse.
- If you have attended any other high schools, make sure a transcript is sent to the eligibility center from each high school.
- When taking the ACT or SAT, request test scores to be sent to the eligibility center (the code is "9999"). No test scores will be accepted unless they come directly from the testing agency.
- Begin your amateurism questionnaire.

GAfutures

To check your current HOPE GPA, please follow these instructions.

- 1. Create an account or login to www.gafutures.com. When creating your profile, make sure you enter your student's social security number.
- 2. Scroll down on the home page. Under "News You Can Use", click on "Shortcuts", and "Your HOPE GPA".
- 3. Follow the prompts to see your updated HOPE report.



HOPE vs. Zell Miller Scholarship

- HOPE Report
 - Available on GaFutures if SSN is on file with the school
- GPA Calculation
 - •Core academic classes only (including foreign language).
 - •Only 0.5 weight given to AP/DE classes and nothing above 4.0.
 - NOT rounded up (2.99 would NOT qualify).
- •4 rigor courses
- How to apply
 - •<u>www.fafsa.ed.gov</u> (1x per year)
 - •gaFutures.org (Covers 4 years)

HOPE

- Covers percentage of tuition
 - Award amount varies depending on type of institution attending (public/private).
- Requirements
 - 3.0 HOPE GPA
- Can earn in College

Zell Miller

- Covers 100% of tuition
 - Award amount varies depending on type of institution attending (public/private).
- Requirements
 - 3.7 "HOPE" GPA
 - 1200 on Math and Reading portions of the SAT or 26 composite on the ACT on a single administration of either test.
 - Must be earned by high school graduation; cannot be earned in college

HOPE Grant

- Pays a percentage of tuition at all Georgia Technical Colleges
- NO High School GPA requirement
- Technical College System (based on 12 hours per semester)
 \$1680 per year (HOPE) and \$2136 per year (Zell)

HOPE Career Grant

Pays 100% for specialty programs:


