ABOUT DENMARK

Denmark High School (DHS), located north of Atlanta, Georgia, is one of the seven traditional high schools in Forsyth County. Established in 2018, DHS is the most diverse high school in the district, with a student body of 2,540 that represents a wide range of cultural backgrounds. As part of the Forsyth County School System, which boasts the highest CCRPI score, graduation rate, SAT, and ACT scores among large districts in metro Atlanta, DHS is dedicated to academic excellence. The school offers a variety of rigorous programs, including the AP Capstone Diploma and several distinct Career Tech pathways.

DHS provides a vibrant extracurricular environment with 85 clubs, 9 honor societies, and 26 varsity athletic teams. Situated in one of the fastest-growing and affluent counties in Georgia, DHS benefits from its location in Forsyth County, recognized as one of the best places to live in America. DHS's diverse and dynamic environment, combined with its commitment to excellence, prepares students to excel in college and beyond.

COURSE INFORMATION

- Students can take the Avant Stamp 4S Proficiency Test and earn up to 3 credits in specific languages.
- Virtual Courses are available through Forsyth Virtual School and Georgia Virtual School
- Dual Enrollment can be taken for free in the state of Georgia at participating colleges.
- Senior Participation in Dual Enrollment: 42%
- AP Precalculus is intended for students who will matriculate to AP Calculus. For students who do not intend to study AP Precalculus, the district offers College Readiness Mathematics, which is aligned to the CLEP College Algebra test (students can then earn 3 hours of College Algebra credit). The district also offers AP Statistics as a 4th math option for students who want to earn college credit based on their AP exam score.

- GPA is a weighted cumulative average.
- One additional quality point is added to AP & Dual Enrollment courses.
- Our school utilizes a modified block schedule. Students participate in 7 classes year-round, and most courses, with the exception of semester (.5) credit courses, are posted as full credits at the end of the year.
- Class rank is determined by a student's weighted cumulative GPA. It includes courses taken within a 7 period day and self-pay courses taken outside of school.
 - Val/Sal is determined once final grades have posted to transcript in late May, prior to graduation.
