

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Must be a U.S. Citizen
- Must be 17—23 years old the day you enroll
- Must not be married
- Must not be pregnant or have legal obligation to support a child


Medical Qualification (DoDMERB)

NOMINATIONS

CONGRESSIONAL

- Each member of congress may nominate up to 10 prospective candidates.
- Every candidate is eligible for:
 - 1x Congressional Representative
 - 2x Senators
 - Vice President
- Every congressional office has different nomination requirements.
