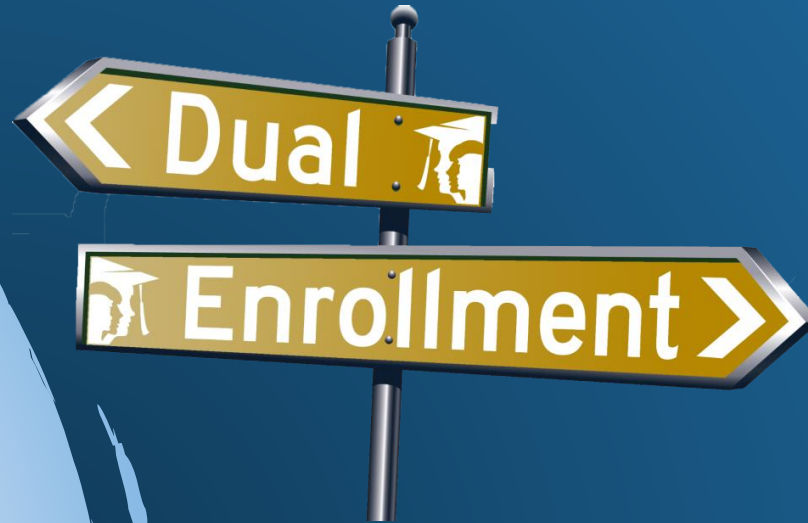

Opportunity for 11th & 12th Grade students to earn high school & college credit at the same time (Select 10th grade eligible based on SAT/ACT scores)

30 hour college credit limit

Offered fall, spring and summer terms

Students can only take DE eligible courses

Tuition free opportunity

Does not count against a students HOPE hours

One full high school credit is earned in a semester of a Dual Enrollment class.

AP vs. Dual Enrollment Considerations



AP Courses

- Take a test in May to receive college credit
- Can take at the high school
- No need to relocate
- No age requirement
- Most universities (in/out state) will accept the credit

- Rigorous
- Rigor points for HOPE/Zell
- Get college credit
- Some universities prefer one over the other



Dual Enrollment

- Attend courses at the institution
- Follows the college/university calendar (NOT FCS)
- All public university in state will accept the credit
- Not all out of state universities will accept the credit

AP vs. Dual Enrollment Considerations



AP Courses

- Typically, year long courses
- More options for support in school
- Passing grade is a 70
- Can retake a high school graduation course for recovery
- Not available in summer

- Final grades earned post on transcript



Dual Enrollment

- Quarter/Semester long courses
- Less access to HS support
- Passing grade is a D
- Withdrawal posts a 59 on high school transcript
- DE Retakes not available
- Summer available with no recovery option

We hope this email finds you well. We wanted to bring to your attention the following information regarding Georgia State University's Dual Enrollment program and the students from your high school who are currently ineligible to participate.

It has come to our attention that the students listed below have received one or more grades below a C- for the Fall 2024 semester, which unfortunately makes them ineligible for continued participation in the Dual Enrollment program at GSU.

As outlined in Georgia State University's Dual Enrollment policy (1150 Dual Enrollment Program), the eligibility requirements for Dual Enrollment are as follows:

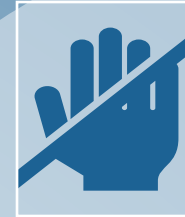
- Students must be entering their junior or senior year of high school at the time of enrollment.
- They must be enrolled in an eligible public or private high school, including unaccredited home study or homeschool programs. Please note that students in unaccredited homeschool programs must also meet admissions homeschool requirements.
- They should be on track towards completing the Required High School Curriculum as established by the USG and high school graduation.
- Students must be legal residents of Georgia for 12 consecutive months before the first day of classes and meet U.S. citizenship requirements.
- Approval from the high school guidance counselor and parent(s)/legal guardian(s) is required.
- ***Finally, to remain eligible for the program, students must achieve a grade of C- or higher in their Georgia State courses.***

I regret to inform you that you have been **dismissed** from the Dual Enrollment Program at the University of North Georgia due to unsatisfactory academic performance, as explained in the UNG policies cited below.

Dual Enrollment Standards of Academic Progress rule: Maintain a 2.5 GPA and complete 67% of all attempted classes. All Dual Enrolled students who fall below a 2.0 overall GPA will be **dismissed** from the program. Students who earn a 2.0 to 2.49 overall GPA will have one semester to raise their overall GPA to a 2.5. Failure to earn an overall GPA of 2.5 will result in dismissal from the program.

*If you are enrolled in Spring 2025 classes, those classes will be dropped on January 10th. Please do not pick-up your books from the UNG bookstore.

If you believe there were extenuating circumstances that led to your dismissal and would like to discuss those, please email the Dean of University College, Dr. Lajuan Simpson-Wilkey (ljajuan.simpson-wilkey@ung.edu), before the January 10th date.



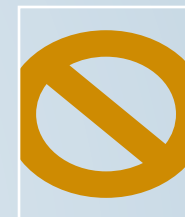
Out-of-state and private colleges may not accept earned college credits.

Due to FERPA Privacy Laws, colleges cannot talk to parents about grades or attendance. Students must be responsible & motivated.



There are major consequences to failing a Dual Enrollment class and all grades are required to be posted on your transcript.

Students are managing two worlds - high school and college. School breaks do not align; testing schedules may overlap.



The high school has no control over college grading, professor communication, college registration parameters, or college course scheduling.

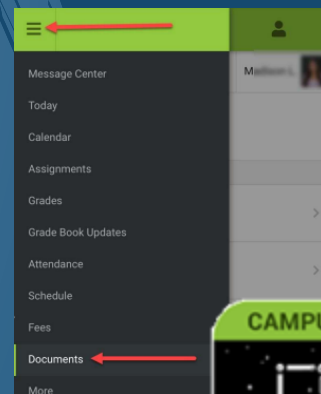

Take SAT, ACT, PSAT, or Accuplacer if required by college and submit scores.

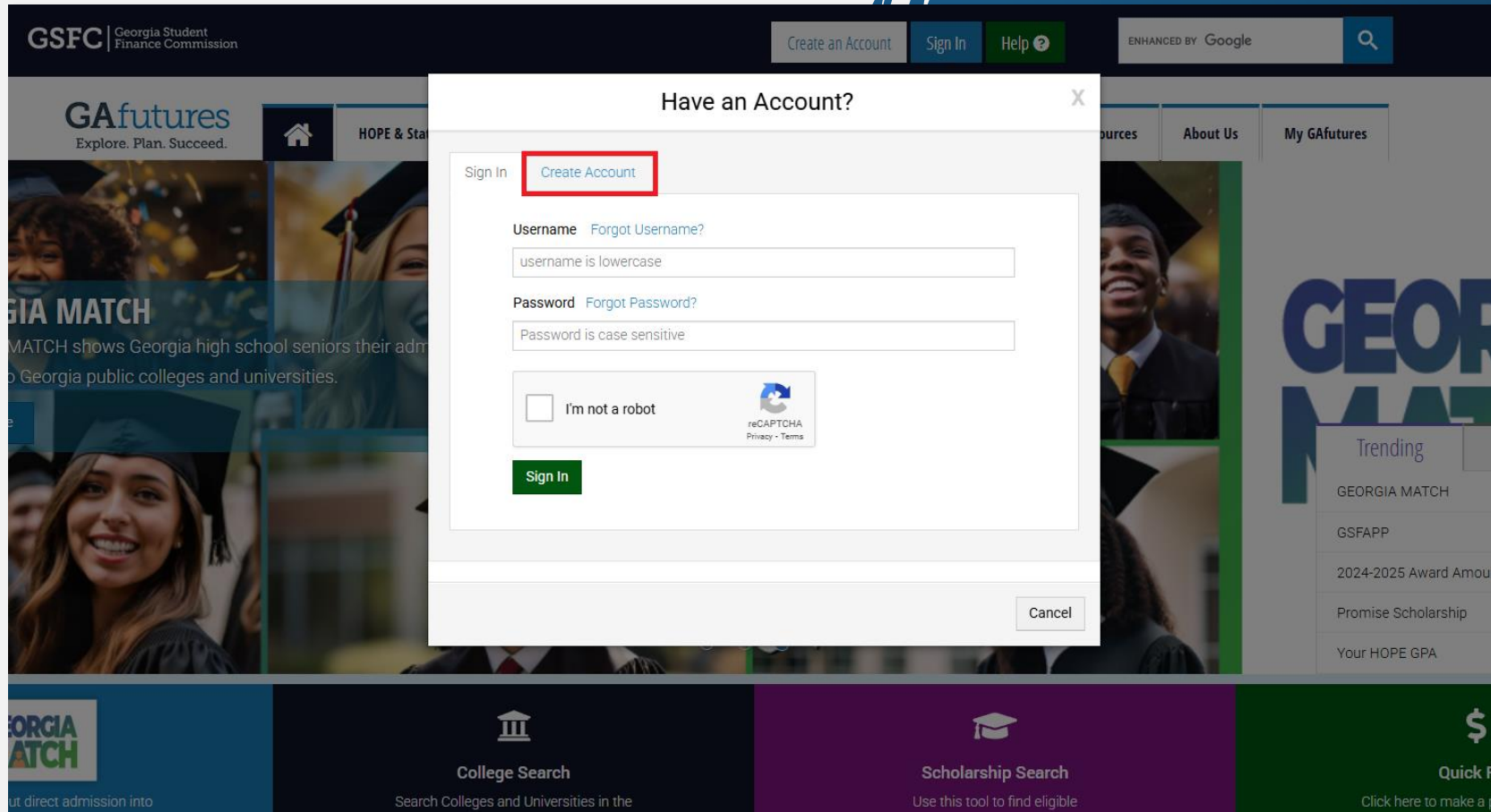

Postsecondary Institution (college) Admissions Application

Students must apply for admission to the postsecondary institution before completing the Dual Enrollment funding application.

Dual Enrollment Funding Application

To apply for Georgia's Dual Enrollment funding program, after selecting "Apply Now," select the application based on the year you plan to participate:

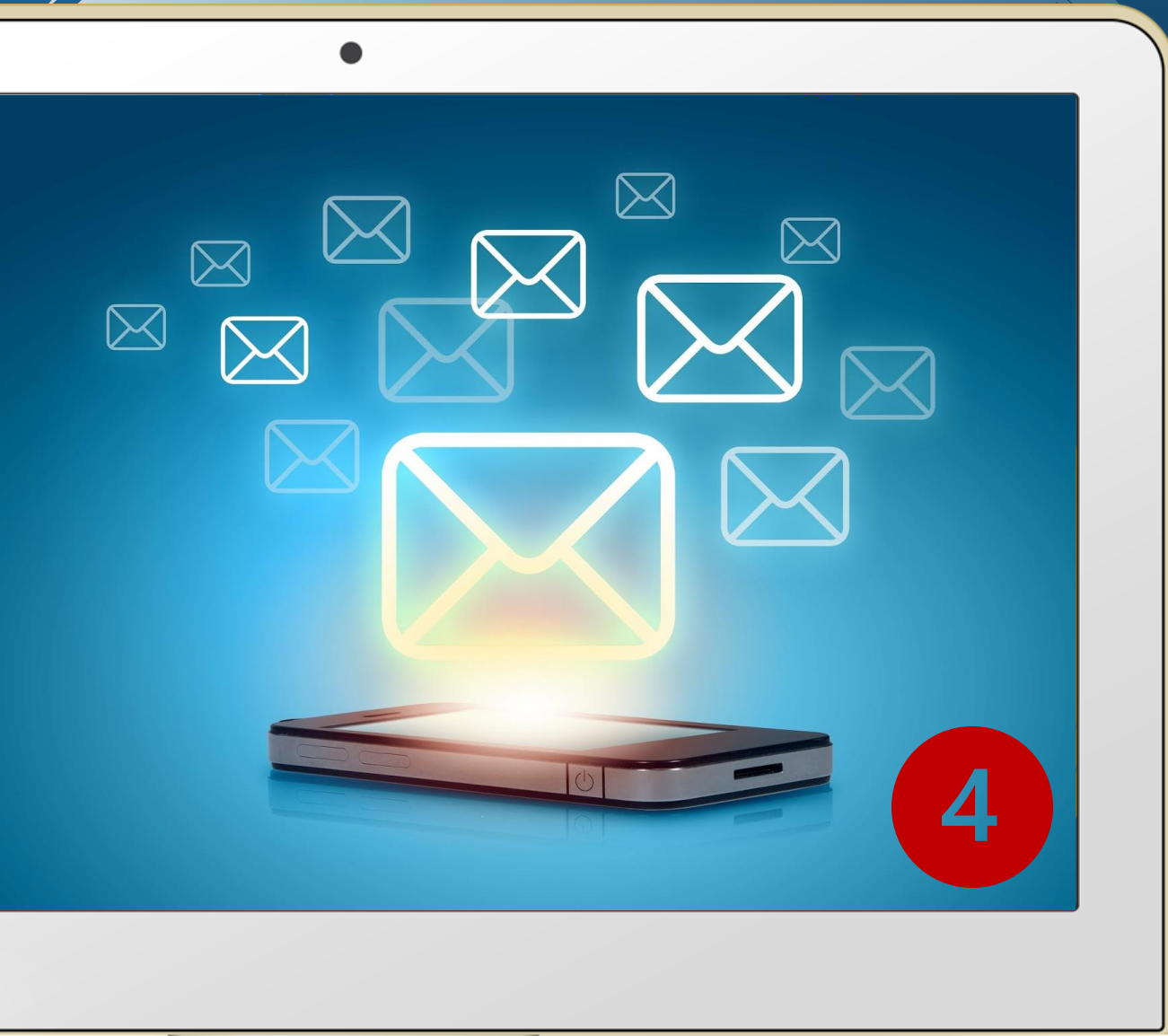
Each academic year's application is valid Summer semester or quarter, Fall semester or quarter, Winter quarter and Spring semester or quarter.
