- Funds are provided to schools that have a high % of students who receive assistance through the free/reduced food program
- Funds are used to promote student academic success
- Students are served based on academic need, <u>NOT</u> according to their free/reduced lunch eligibility
- Part of Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA)
 - ESSA makes sure all schools provide quality education
 - Title I is based on improving student achievement and including strategies to support family engagement
 - Services benefit all students

MATH GOAL

Chestatee will improve student achievement in mathematics as measured by the Georgia Milestone assessment in grades 3rd-5th and the FCS Big 20 in grades K-5. The percentage of 3rd-5th students scoring at the proficient level or above on the math GMA will increase from **51%** (spring 2023) to **56%** (spring 2025) and the percentage of K-5 students demonstrating grade level math proficiency on the FCS Big 10/20 will be 56% or higher by May 2025.

READING GOAL

Chestatee will improve student achievement in ELA/Reading as measured by the Georgia Milestone Assessment in grades 3rd-5th and the i-Ready Diagnostic in grades K-5. The percentage of 3rd-5th students scoring at the proficient level or above on the ELA/GMA will increase from 40% (Spring 2023) to 50% (Spring 2025) and the percentage of K-5 students reading grade level text or higher with basic comprehension proficiency will be 50% or higher as measured by the i-Ready Diagnostic by May 2025.

Collaborative Teams

K-5 Collaborative Teams will meet weekly to plan quality, differentiated instruction based on the 4 guiding questions of the PLC:

- What is it we want our students to know and be able to do?
- How will we know if each student has learned it?
- How will we respond when some students do not learn it?
- How will we extend the learning for students who have demonstrated proficiency?

Professional learning will support collaborative team leaders in facilitating their CT and team members in regards to deconstructing standards, planning for assessment, analyzing data and planning for high impact instruction.

Coaches will work with collaborative teams to cultivate collective efficacy and continue **professional learning** and growth towards becoming highly effective collaborative teams.

Professional Learning

ELA and Math

Teachers will participate in professional learning of high leverage instructional strategies for engagement, feedback, rigor, and student autonomy as well as best practices in ELA and Math instruction. The professional learning will include training for the use of instructional resources for literacy and math instruction as well as instructional resources related to best practice and pedagogy.





Extended Collaboration

Professional LEARNING

The professional learning calendar will include extended collaboration sessions for building capacity of professional learning and collaboration to address the depth, complexity, and integration of the ELA and Math standards. Instructional coaches and PLC team leaders will provide PL to build capacity for deconstructing standards, aligning assessments, and calibrating instructional practices for a high impact on student learning. Substitutes will be provided for job-embedded professional development for team members.





SCHOOL AND HOME ACADEMIC ENGAGEMENT

Collaborative teams will work to improve academic engagement both at school and at home by identifying and implementing high leveraged strategies to increase student engagement. Chestatee faculty and staff will host family academic events to build parent capacity with early reading skills and math skills. Teachers will model engagement strategies for parents and students during these events in order to connect student learning at school and home.

TITLE 1 TEACHER TO REDUCE CLASS SIZE

Chestatee will provide a reduced class size model for grades 1 and 3. Additionally, one ela supplemental support teacher will provide additional reading and ela support for at-risk students in grades 3-5.





INSTRUCTIONAL EXTENSION

Chestatee will provide extended instructional opportunities for students identified most at risk in third through fifth grades.

What tests will my child be taking this year?

School and District

- Forsyth County School's Universal Screening-iReady (3 times a year)
 - Measures <u>reading and math achievement</u> Kindergarten through 5th Grade.
 - Students are expected to score above the 30 %ile each administration.
 - Targeted students are then screened with FastBridge
- Forsyth County School's Big 20 Assessment
 - Measures grade level <u>math achievement</u> Kindergarten through 5th Grade
 - Students are expected to score 70% or higher by the end of the school year.





What is Title I?

Title I is a federally funded program that is intended to supplement the regular classroom curriculum. Students are provided extra assistance in reading and/or math. The program's goal is to support students so that every child meets and/or exceeds the state's standards. A variety of teaching methods and materials are used to reinforce curriculum concepts.

Chestatee Elementary is identified as schoolwide Title I as part of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA). A school-wide Title I program ensures the success of all students. Everyone has access to the numerous resources and materials purchased with Title I funds, including iPads, laptops, computer programs, books, manipulatives, and learning games. Because of Title I, you and your child have access to excellent resources and enriching programs.

School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it? This plan describes how Chestatee Elementary School (CHE) will provide opportunities to improve parent engagement to support student learning. The staff and parents at CHE are committed to providing a quality education for all our students. To achieve this goal, the teachers, and staff at CHE realize that a strong partnership between the school and home is essential. 


