#### School Goals by end of 2024-25

Chestatee will improve student achievement in ELA/Reading as measured by the Georgia Milestone Assessment in grades 3rd-5th. The percentage of 3rd-5th students scoring at the proficient level or above on the ELA/GMA will increase from **40%** (Spring 2023) to **50%** (Spring 2025).

Chestatee will improve student achievement in mathematics as measured by the Georgia Milestone assessment in grades 3rd-5th. The percentage of 3rd-5th students scoring at the proficient level or above on the math GMA will increase from 51% (spring 2023) to 56% (spring 2025).
